## SENIOR SUBJECT SELECTION PRE-REQUISITE POLICY

At Tannum Sands SHS we have high expectations and a strong belief that every student can succeed.

Our Year 11&12 senior programs, complimented by programs delivered by off-site providers, offer a diverse range of academic and vocational pathways, ensuring that every student can engage, achieve and successfully transition to further education, training and employment when they graduate.

A successful graduate of our school will achieve their QCE/QCIA and one or more of the following:

- An ATAR = pathways to tertiary studies
- Certificate II VET qualifications = foundation skills for employment or further training
- Certificate III VET qualification = advanced preparation for employment or further education

**Senior Education and Training (SET) Plans** are completed by every student in Year 10. These plans are developed in **Careers and Transition** lessons and involve investigating options, researching career pathways and setting goals to achieve meaningful qualifications. A member of Administration will meet with every Year 10 and their parent/guardian early in Term 4 to complete a **Senior Enrolment Interview**.

Our staff will provide ongoing monitoring and support to every student throughout their senior years at school. They will share the responsibility with parents to assist students to achieve their SET Plan goals. Senior students need to be self-motivated and mature in their approach to their studies. They must adopt effective study routines, engage in class and work independently and to the best of their ability.

In order to maximise students' chances of achieving success, subject choices need to be informed, they need to enable students' to be successful and they need to support students' chosen career pathways. Our School's **Senior Subject Pre-Requisite Policy** is designed to ensure that every student achieves academic success in their senior phase of learning.

Automatic Entry into Year 11 subjects requires the following benchmarks to be met:

- 94% attendance
- B standard in Effort and Behaviour on Term 1 & 2 reports
- Demonstrated cooperation and safety standards in workshop / practical subjects
- Sound Literacy and Numeracy skills
- Minimum academic standards set for each subject see attached table.

Students will need to maintain the standards throughout Year 10 to retain their place in the subject. Subjects will only run where sufficient numbers of students (minimum 18), teachers and resources are available.

## Process:


Year 10 students will select subjects for Year 11&12 at the end of Term 2. Early in Term 3, Heads of Department will approve selections for student who meet minimum benchmarks (Term 1 & 2 Reports).

Where a student does not meet the benchmarks for chosen subject/s, the following process will apply.

- 1. Students and parents will be notified in writing. The Head of Department will discuss options with students this may include the student making a more appropriate subject choice (E.G. Sport & Recreation instead of Physical Education) or the student and parent committing to a Learning Contract (student works towards meeting the benchmark by the end of Term 3 and/or 4).
- 2. Where a student has not met pre-requisites across multiple subjects, they must meet with the Guidance Officer to review their SET Plan, select an appropriate course of study and discuss strategies to achieve success.
- 3. Students who are unable to meet pre-requisites by the end of Year 10 will need to meet with the Principal and a parent for a decision. The final decision will be based on ensuring successful outcome for students. Ongoing monitoring and review will be enacted to ensure commitment.
